First United Methodist Church of Pensacola launches First Church Respite Ministry

A new ministry designed to support individuals living with dementia and their caregivers is opening in November 2024 at First United Methodist Church of Pensacola.

For two days a week, First Church Respite Ministry will provide a fun, engaging environment for participants to enjoy social, recreational, and enrichment activities while their caregivers get a four-hour respite.

First Church Respite Ministry is part of a larger network of respite ministries adopting a successful volunteer-based model of care promoted by the Respite for All Foundation (RFA) to support individuals living with Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia as well as their caregivers.

While we understand that Alzheimer's and dementia diseases are progressive conditions, the participants who would most likely benefit from the program are those who can participate in group settings for a long period and are able to feed themselves and move around. This ministry is not just for our own church members. We invite others in the area living with a dementia-related disease who would benefit from these social and relational activities.

This low-cost, high-engagement RFA program is run by a part-time staff director together with trained volunteers and is a ministry of First United Methodist Church of Pensacola. Because the model is a social program, no medical training is required for volunteers. From one to four days a week, participants are led through recreational and enrichment activities and can enjoy a hot lunch with friends. At the same time, caregivers get a much-needed break when they can leave their loved ones with trusted volunteers for four hours.

Dr. Guttmann specializes in neurodegenerative diseases with a focus on Alzheimer's. His research has made critical strides in understanding how oxidative stress impacts brain health and has contributed to identifying early biomarkers of Alzheimer's disease in blood and cerebrospinal fluid, supported by significant NIH grants. In 2018, local advocates saw a crucial need for shelter and support for homeless families. After learning of the Family Promise model, a group of volunteers committed to forming our affiliate here in Escambia County. Family Promise of Escambia County (FPEC, Inc.) was officially established in January 2020.

Our mission is to help families in Northwest Florida achieve housing stability through community-based response, one family at a time.

FPEC primarily serves families in Escambia County. However through partnerships with local churches we will also walk alongside churches in Santa Rosa County. Any families with children ages 0-18 experiencing homelessness are served by FPEC. According to Escambia County schools there are currently over 2,050 children experiencing homelessness in K-12 schools.

Our organization works to strengthen and enhance the lives of children and their families by providing stability through significant life events. These events can often cause financial hardship and loss of stable housing. We provide shelter, support, coaching, mentoring, counseling, and community support that brings about transformative stability. We are dedicated to the care of families in Escambia County. This work is not done in

a vacuum. Instead, we are representative of a comprehensive network of interfaith congregations, non profits, individuals, and businesses. This team approach to radical hospitality, compassion and support has led us to an extraordinary success rate nationally. Through our Interfaith Hospitality Network, faith organizations provide unoccupied spaces as a safe, warm place for families to sleep at night. Our Family Center provides a place for families to meet basic needs including internet access, showers, and laundry facilities. The staff and volunteers at the Family Center provide case management connecting families with financial resources and assisting in the search for jobs, affordable housing, and education as well as offer mentorship and support.

FUMC Pensacola is a Family Promise Affiliate. We will connect and work with 11 other churches in our area to help solve this challenge in our community by providing shelter throughout the year. For one week each quarter, we will provide special, safe place in our Wright Place building where a family can spend one week together as they work toward permanent housing with Family Promise. We will also offer our hospitality through meals, activities, and volunteer presence so that these families can heal and work toward independence. First Church hosted our first family September 1 - 8! We also provide a space on our campus for a Day Center that is utilized by families throughout the county as well as provide office space for Family Promise Staff.


