WELCOME TO FIRST CHURCH

We are delighted that you have chosen to worship with us this Pentecost Sunday. Founded in 1821, First Church is the oldest Protestant church in the area and the oldest Methodist church in Florida. This historic church, with four regular Sunday services, has a membership of 3200 and is overflowing with life. If you are visiting, we hope that you will consider becoming a member of our church family. You may join any Sunday by profession of faith or transfer of membership. PENTECOST

Today is the Day of Pentecost (often called the birthday of the church). Pentecost is the fiftieth day of Easter. The earliest church in Jerusalem had completed forty days of ongoing teaching from the Risen Lord, followed by a ten-day prayer vigil after his ascension. On the fiftieth day, the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and the church began to move out in and by the Spirit's power. Today, we commemorate that occasion in our worship.

About the Cover Art: Pentecost by Donald Jackson — In this scene, the devout Jews from every nation under heaven are already in Jerusalem for the great Jewish pilgrimage feast of Pentecost which occurs fifty days after Passover. The depiction here combines the events of Pentecost in Acts 2:1-13 with the explanation given by Saint Peter in his speech, Acts 2:14-39. The artist use many local associations from St. John's University in this illumination. Most visible is the Saint John's Abbey and University Church emerging from the wall of the golden Jerusalem

TODAY'S LECTIONARY SCRIPTURE

THE DAY OF PENTECOST

The First Reading—Acts 2:1-21—the story of the Holy Spirit filling the apostles and empowering them to share the message of the gospel with people of different languages.

The Psalter—Psalm 104:24-34, 35b—The psalm describes the wonders of the world created and renewed by the Lord's Spirit.

The Second Reading—Romans 8:14-17—when we are moved by God's Spirit, we become God's children and heirs with Christ.

The Gospel—John 14:8-17 (25-27)—Jesus tells his disciples that in him the Father has been revealed, and he promises the gift of another Counselor, the Spirit of truth, to be with them.

DAILY READINGS - PROPER 5

Each of us is encouraged to read scripture during the week. The Daily Readings are taken from "The Daily Office Lectionary" in The Book of Common Prayer. Make a commitment this summer to read scripture each day. It will be a blessing. It can change your life.

In place of the Old Testament readings this Thursday through Saturday, our readings are from the Book of Ecclesiasticus, also called Wisdom of Sirach, or simply Sirach. This book may not be in many of our Bibles; it is found among the 14 books of the Apocrypha. Biblical apocrypha is a set of texts included in the Latin Vulgate and Septuagint but not in the Hebrew Bible. While Catholic tradition considers some of these texts to be deuterocanonical, Protestants consider them apocryphal (of unknown authorship or of doubtful origin). These writings are yet valuable and should be read. You can find this week's Ecclesiasticus readings in a Bible that includes the Apocrypha and online.
