HYMN NOTES

“Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing” (words: Robert Robinson, 1758; music: from Wyeth’s Repository of Sacred Music, Part Second, 1813)—Born of humble parents, Robinson could not afford schooling for the ministry, so was apprenticed at fourteen to a London barber and hairdresser. After a dissolute youth he was converted by George Whitefield and became a Calvinistic Methodist minister. Like John Newton’s more famous “Amazing Grace,” his hymn is one of providence and grace. Like Jacob, who raised an Ebenezer (a stone altar which signified that God had brought him thus far), he confesses how great a debtor he is to the grace of God, as are we all.

TODAY'S LECTIONARY SCRIPTURES

First Lesson: 2 Samuel 5:1-5, 9-10. After the civil war is finished, the tribes of Israel call upon David to be their kmg. At Hebron, David makes a covenant with the people and he is made king, to rule over them for forty years. His reign is blessed because God is with him.

Psalm 48. This song extols Zion, the city of God. Because of God's steadfast love, the whole of Zion is called to praise its founder, who will guide her for ever.

Second Lesson: 2 Corinthians 12:2-10. Paul refers to his experience of ecstasy but discounts it as a cause for boasting. He talks about his "thorn in the flesh," given by Satan, to keep him humble and to glorify God.

Gospel Lesson: Mark 6:1-13. While teaching in the temple, Jesus—"the son of Mary" (a slur against him)—is rejected by his own people and is able to heal but a few people. Jesus calls the twelve together and sends them out, two by two, to preach repentance, cast out demons and heal the sick.

DAILY READINGS

The daily readings expand the range of biblical reading in worship and personal devotion by providing daily citations for a three-year cycle. These readings complement the Sunday readings: Monday through Wednesday readings help the reader reflect on and digest what they heard in worship. Thursday through Saturday readings help prepare the reader for the Sunday ahead.

MISSION FOCUS

JULY FOCUS: United Methodist Women

Mission and Outreach is at the heart of the ministry of The United Methodist Women (UMW) at First Church. The UMW is a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church. Our chapter of the UMW was founded in 1890 and has grown to have a membership of over 160, with seven circles providing an opportunity for Bible study, mission emphasis and projects, and fellowship. Last year the UMW raised over \$31,000 for local missions through various fundraising activities, including the annual events of Saturday Morning with Friends, Designing Women's Luncheon, and the Christmas Creations Arts and Crafts Show. In addition to raising money, and being actively involved in all mission areas of the church, the UMW also runs Suit Yourself, a clothes closet for women in need who are retuning to work.

CALLS TO ACTION: 1) Support the Suit Yourself ministry with donations of new, unopened make-up items including: lipstick, travel-size toiletries, mascara, blush, nail polish, lip liners, face powder and eye-brow pens. 2) Attend the Missions and Muffins Open House next Sunday.
