### HYMN NOTES

“Make Me a Captive, Lord” (words by George Matheson, 1890; music by George J. Elvey, 1868)—Entitled “Christian Freedom” and using the Ephesians 3:1 text, “Paul, the prisoner of Christ,” the hymn is an excellent example of the use of paradox: captive-free, give up sword-conqueror be, imprison-strong, monarch throne-crown resign. The phrase “varies with the wind” refers to the amount of tension with which a spring is wound, not to the blowing of the wind. The author was a brilliant student and preacher, but suffered poor eyesight, being virtually blind by his 18th birthday.

## TODAY'S LECTIONARY SCRIPTURES

**First Lesson: 2 Samuel 11:25–12:13a.** After the death of Uriah, David marries Bathsheba. Nathan the prophet tells a parable which indicts David for his sin. David is moved to repentance.

**Psalm: 51:1-12.** David's prayer of confession and forgiveness. He depends solely upon the mercy of God to redeem him and restore his salvation.

**Second Lesson: Ephesians 4:1-16.** Paul exhorts the Ephesians to forbear one another for the sake of the Church's unity. He says that Christ called people to various ministries for the building up of the body. Therefore, they are to "speak the truth in love."

**Gospel Lesson: John 6:24-35.** In response to the miraculous feeding, some people follow Jesus again. He tells them that the true bread they seek is not the manna Israel ate in the desert but to do the works of God.

## DAILY READINGS

The daily readings expand the range of biblical reading in worship and personal devotion by providing daily citations for a three-year cycle. These readings complement the Sunday readings: Monday through Wednesday readings help the reader reflect on and digest what they heard in worship. Thursday through Saturday readings help prepare the reader for the Sunday ahead.
