TODAY'S LECTIONARY SCRIPTURES

All Saints

First Lesson: Revelation 7:9-17. John's vision of the white-robed saints who have come through the tribulation. No longer do they hunger or thirst; they are sheltered by the presence of God who sits in the throne.

Psalms: 34:1-10, 22. Upon his deliverance from the hand of Abimelech, David sings a song of praise for the goodness of God, and exhorts Israel to seek and trust the Lord.

Second Lesson: 1 John 3:1-3. John presents the promise that when Christ appears we shall be like him. Therefore, hope in the Lord and be made pure.

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 5:1-12. As he opens the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus offers a listing of the characteristics of the saints: "Blessed are those . . ."

Twenty-Second Sunday After Pentecost

First Lesson: Joshua 3:7-17. Joshua prepares the people for their entry into the new land. As God had promised, when the Ark of the Covenant enters Jordan it stops flowing and all cross over on dry land.

Psalms: 107:1-7, 33-37. The people are called to praise God whose "steadfast love and endures forever." One reason for this praise is that God blesses the earth.

Second Lesson: 1 Thessalonians 2:9-13. Paul recalls his previous work among the Thessalonians, and argues that the word they have received from him was of God as evidenced by their lives.

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 23:1-12. Jesus warns his disciples against being like the Pharisees who do not practice what they preach. Rather, they are to be humble toward one another: "The great among you shall be your servant; whoever exalts self will be humbled."

DAILY READINGS

The daily readings expand the range of biblical reading in worship and personal devotion by providing daily citations for a three-year cycle. These readings complement the Sunday readings: Monday through Wednesday readings help the reader reflect on and digest what they heard in worship. Thursday through Saturday readings help prepare the reader for the Sunday ahead.
