ADVENT

Today is the First Sunday of Advent! The Advent season marks the start of a new church year. The season begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends at sundown on Christmas Eve. Advent comes from the Latin word, *adventus*, meaning “coming.” It is a season to prepare for the coming of Christ in various meanings: the promised coming of the Messiah to the Jews, the coming of Jesus being born in Bethlehem, the promised return of the risen Christ in final victory, and the continual coming of Christ into the lives and hearts of believers. Join us throughout this Advent season as we prepare our hearts for the coming.

TODAY’S LECTIONARY SCRIPTURES¹

The Christian Year opens with promises and prayers: promises of the coming reign of God and prayers that the people God will be ready for that reign.

The Old Testament—Jeremiah 33:14-16. “an announcement that the ancient promise of a Davidic messiah will be fulfilled and Jerusalem will dwell secure.”

The Psalter—Psalm 25:1-10. “a prayer for help and forgiveness, reaffirming the righteousness and faithfulness of God, which are expressed in the reading from Jeremiah 33.

The Epistle—1 Thessalonians 3:9-13. “Paul’s prayer that he be allowed to join the faithful in Thessalonica becomes a petition that they be ready for the coming of the Lord.”

The Gospel—Luke 21:25-26. “sets the season of Advent into an eschatological (a ‘future-oriented’) framework: the signs in the heavens indicate that the kingdom of God is near.”

¹ HYMN NOTES

“O Come, O Come, Emmanuel” (words, 9th century Latin; music, 15th century French)—From the seven antiphons sung in the medieval Roman Church at Vespers before and after the Magnificat (Mary’s Song), just prior to Christmas, sometime in the 13th century five were selected for a hymn and the “Rejoice, rejoice” refrain added. Biblical references to the Great “O”s are: Emmanuel (Isaiah 7:14), Root of Jesse (Isaiah 11:10), Dayspring (Malachi 4:2), Key of David (Isaiah 22:22), and O Lord (Adonai) (Exodus 3:15). The purpose of Advent is to prepare for Christmas, as Lent prepares for Easter.
